Asbestos illegally imported from China provokes guestions and anger in SA

CAN YOU BELIEVE IT ???

FROM THE MOUTH OF A FEDERAL POLITICIAN

Immigration Minister Peter Dutton has attacked the construction union for forcing up building costs and driving Australian companies to "cut corners" by importing cheap Chinese materials that may contain deadly asbestos.

"They talk about a 40 per cent additional cost in building a block of units because of CFMEU - involvement, and obviously that has some behaviours, including driving builders to use this product, which is completely unacceptable,"

"There are a number of reasons that they're cutting corners - one is that they are being -driven into the ground by the CFMEU and these other thugs walking around on building sites, including bikies employed by the CFMEU."

I would like to know does the Minister really believe in what he is saying or will he acknowledge that <u>maybe just maybe</u> the building companies and others who import these products into Australia might make a significant increase in profit.? Also the importation of children's products (Dora the Explorer Crayons for instance) and I accept the asbestos in them is encapsulated in the wax and removes the risk of inhalation but the FACT is it BROKE AUSTRALIAN LAW by being imported here.

Whilst I agree that there is not enough people in Australian Border Force to cover the whole of imports. I do believe that if / when a company is identified with products containing asbestos (YUANDA) the whole of their imports should be inspected for the next three years, no matter how long it takes.

From what we see, hear and read about asbestos coming into this country the majority of identification queries are coming from the workers themselves, we also note that the products are coming from China or Chinese owned companies, who obviously have now respect for Australian Law. I'm pretty sure if the situation was reversed China would have no hesitation in dealing with the issue in a most severe manner, unlike our Government.

One of the many ways that AVA spreads the message about the services it offers to the community is through the systematic distribution of its brochures to Hospitals, Medical Centres, and to other community groups. These brochures relate to information about asbestos and asbestos related disease, support for those affected by asbestos related disease, and to the provision of information sessions and training programmers'.

In return, the visits give our volunteers an opportunity to find out more about services which can complement the diagnosis and specific treatment offered by specialists, and so we thought it may be useful to regularly share with you some of the very supportive centre's that we have visited.

The old Blackwood Hospital is now the home of Integrated Health Solutions, and a compounding pharmacy, and has nearly 20 allied practitioners who offer a diverse range of conventional and complementary health services. Practice Manager Britt Wilson said IHS treated people with complex medical problems in a multi-disciplinary way. Under its umbrella, integrated doctors and counselors together with practitioners specializing in complementary therapies such as remedial massage, oncology massage, lymphatic drainage and acupuncture to name a few, operate from there in a setting of beautiful gardens and peaceful atmosphere. One of the directors, Dr. Sinclair Bode is well known in the area as both a GP and for his knowledge of complex issues and complementary therapies, and all specialists work together with a caring and integrated health focus.

Another visit was to Griffiths Rehabilitation Hospital, and it was uplifting to talk to Annie Betham and hear her ask about the needs of people with asbestos related disease and how Griffiths could offer a number of options for supervised activity, which could work in conjunction with other professionals, and enhance the wellness of people through a range of supervised activities and use of the pool in the centre.

ASBESTOS FREE ?? Pam Sandys

Over the past couple of months there have been articles in the newspapers and on tv about asbestos matters – exposure of personnel on worksites during renovations, more discoveries at sites where new buildings are being erected, on demolition sites, during clean – up operations following fires, floods, etc. The list seems to grow almost weekly.

Asbestos contaminated products are being detected by people who have innocently purchased goods from overseas suppliers. Too many items are later discovered to contain asbestos. This is in spite of such items having been labelled "asbestos free", or certified as uncontaminated, by the exporters.

Asbestos is still being mined, and manufactured into goods, in a number of countries. Such products can be sold at cheaper prices to people all over the world. It is usually by accident that asbestos is found to be present in imported materials. By then the damage has been done.

Here in South Australia workers have very recently been exposed to asbestos fibres in Port Pirie, on the smelter redevelopment site where newly imported equipment is being used.

Only about 5% of all the goods imported into our country is being checked by our authorities, due to the overwhelming quantity of imports reaching Australian ports.

It's not just a problem for South Australia. All across the country, there are more and more building sites where materials are found to contain asbestos.

There have been calls for new federal legislation to be passed requiring mandatory inspection and / or testing of all products from countries which have been found to have bypassed Australian standards.

Those found guilty of such breaches need to have penalties imposed.

Such calls have come from politicians, safety bodies, contractors, unions, and advocacy groups, to name just a few of concerned citizens.

How can we support all these bodies? Not by ignoring the problem, or dismissing concerns as misguided obsessions. It is surely a question which needs to be debated at the upcoming International Asbestos Awareness & Management Conference which will be held in Adelaide, 13th -15th November 2016


