Mr Werfel said that he was relieved that court proceedings had concluded. "This has been a long journey and I want to thank my family for staying the course with me. Justice has finally been achieved and I fought this fight for my family and for future asbestos sufferers, so their legal situation will be improved."

Asbestos manufacturers may now have to run public awareness campaigns to educate the public on the dangers of asbestos during home renovations, after the High Court rejected an application for special leave to appeal in Werfel v. Amaca Pty Limited (formerly James Hardie & Coy Pty Limited).

Turner Freeman Lawyers Partner
Annie Hoffman has run successful litigation
against James Hardie for Adelaide man
Mathew Werfel right up to the High Court,
and said today that she was relieved that her
client's courtroom odyssey for justice was
finally over.

The original decision in December 2020 by the full court of the Supreme Court of South Australia rejected an appeal by James Hardie against a precedent-setting asbestos compensation claim, unanimously finding that the company owed the public a duty of care to warn them of the risks posed by in-situ asbestos cement products.

Turner Freeman Lawyers ran the case for 44-year-old Adelaide father-of-three Mathew Werfel and the decision potentially opened up compensation claims for people who contract mesothelioma due to home

renovations. Mr Werfel was exposed to asbestos while working for a fencing contractor after leaving school and during home renovations, including when he sanded and painted the eaves of his first home, not realising that they were constructed from asbestos cement sheets.

James Hardie's legal liability has now been confirmed to be beyond the products they sold to end users and to extend to all those who may come into contact with those products in future, including those who are still being exposed during home renovations.

"The Full Court confirmed that James Hardie had a duty of care to the public to warn them of the ongoing risks posed by their asbestos products, and remains legally liable for the lives these products continue to destroy," Annie Hoffman said. "This decision sets a precedent for any person who contracts mesothelioma due to drilling, sanding, cutting or handling James Hardie asbestos cement in their homes."

BEINKE BEQUEST FUND

The Beinke Bequest Fund has been set up to honour the name of one of AVA's benefactors, Peter Beinke, who died from mesothelioma in 2014.

Mr Beinke wanted to ease the burden for people affected by asbestos disease and left a bequest to AVA to be used towards expenses incurred when it is necessary to travel some distance for tests or treatment.

The fund is available to help with travel & accommodation expenses for patients with an asbestos related disease (ARD) who are required to travel to Adelaide for treatment. The funding can also cover expenses of family members who accompany patients. These expenses may be covered in whole or in part, and will be reimbursed on production of receipts.

LUNG FOUNDATION AUSTRALIA

Lung Foundation Australia is warning people with a persistent cough not to brush off what it says could be the warning signs of lung cancer.

The advocacy group and charity has launched a campaign urging anyone with a cough that lasts for at least three weeks to visit their GP for a check-up. "This is critical if other symptoms such as fatigue, shortness of breath or chest discomfort are also present, even if they are mild," a spokesperson for the group said.

What if your cough isn't just a cough?

Lung Foundation Australia CEO Mark Brooke said early investigation by a health professional was key to improving survival rates. "This is particularly important if you have any risk factors such as history of smoking, occupation exposure to asbestos, dust or chemicals, or if you are aged over 40," he said. "We don't want any Australian self-diagnosing or dismissing potential symptoms of lung cancer".

Mr Brooke said the early warning signs were easy to miss when it came to lung cancer or lung disease which could affect anyone, irrespective of lifestyle choices.

"For the vast majority of us, a new cough will not be a cause for concern," Lung Foundation Australia chair Professor Christine Jenkins said. "For some, however, a lingering cough could be a sign of something more serious, such as a lung disease or lung cancer".

PRODUCT RECALL ALERT – ASBESTOS RISK

Asbestos is a known carcinogen and inhaling asbestos fibres can cause a number of life-threatening diseases including pleural disease, asbestosis, mesothelioma and lung cancer.

L O'Reilly Pty Ltd trading as OMP has issued a product recall for their ECX AMP series of 1:10 **radio-controlled electric 2WD vehicles**. The ECX1024 slipper pads in these ECX AMP series of vehicles contain chrysotile asbestos.



Asbestos fibres may be released from the slipper pad in the vehicle through

friction and users may be exposed to asbestos fibres if the vehicle is disassembled for repair or maintenance.

Owners of these vehicles must not attempt to remove or replace the slipper pads, or disassemble and maintain their vehicles. Affected vehicles should be returned to their place of purchase.

NATIONAL ASBESTOS AWARENESS WEEK – THINK TWICE ABOUT ASBESTOS

National Asbestos Awareness Week runs from 22—26 November 2021. This year, we're asking you to **think twice about asbestos**.

Asbestos causes cancer and is still in 1 in 3 Aussie homes. Prevent the risk of exposure to asbestos and find out how to be safe.

Before you start any work around the house, check whether your home was built before 1990. If so, it can contain asbestos.

Asbestos can be in many locations including external and internal walls, bathrooms, toilets and laundries, kitchens, roofs, fences, and garages.

Don't risk your health or someone else's by disturbing asbestos. To prevent breathing in dangerous asbestos fibres, always get a licensed asbestos professional to check for asbestos before starting work on homes built before 1990.



Think twice about asbestos. Asbestos is dangerous if damaged, disturbed or deteriorating. Once asbestos fibres are disturbed they become airborne and can then be inhaled or ingested. This can happen when sanding, drilling, cutting or sawing asbestos-containing materials.


